### **Honoring God with our Bodies!!!**

The Senior Lunch Bunch on January 29 heard from Cameron Eichler, a hearing specialist who described the types of hearing losses common as people grow older. He reminded me that there IS a great deal we can do for our bodies and our health. Instead of describing future SLB meetings, I want to outline my "Prescription for Healthy Living". We meet again on February 26. CHECK US OUT!

The evidence is in about the relationship between body, mind and spirit. What Christians who read Mark 20 carefully (The Shema: we are to love God with our whole body, heart, mind and soul) have known for centuries is that healthy living ALWAYS includes our total life. I want to share a list of the key things most of us know as to HOW WE CAN MAXIMIZE OUR HEALTHINESS or what we might call PREVENTIVE HEALTH MAINTENANCE.

Stop smoking and avoid high air pollution places (like casinos where smoking is allowed)

- DO eat MORE fruits and vegetables (nuts are good too) and fewer carbohydrates and fats; for most of us, eat smaller portions and skip the desserts except for special times;
- DO exercise walk, do sit-ups, push-ups, weight lifting either with others in a facility or at home while watching the news or weather on t-v;
- DO take a multivitamin each day. The reports are in; one-a-day won't hurt and it may help; DON'T skip healthy foods because you did your vitamins though;
- DO get adequate rest; America is in a chronic sleep-loss-stupor though none of us HAS TO BE SLEEP DEPRIVED;
- Learn to be your own care-taker for any chronic disease you find that you have; YOU, not your spouse or children or the doctor are the one in charge of handling your high blood pressure, cholesterol, arthritis or bronchitis/ emphysema. THIS IS MOST CERTAINLY TRUE!!!
- Finally, commit your life to what counselors call "High Level Wellness" or what I call an attitude of positive energy for living. That will direct you to a health-maintaining life style. See you in church (because being at one in your spirit is also a high level wellness issue)!!


