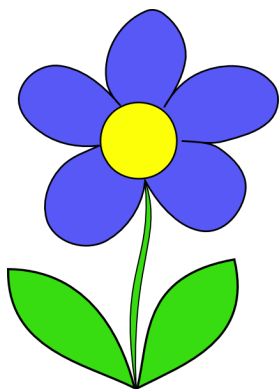


Little Lambs Preschool



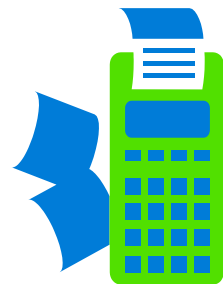

Receipts

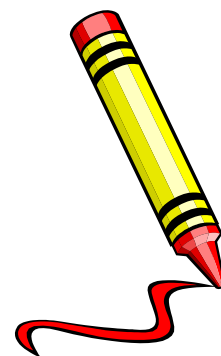

Thoughts on Retirement

Isaiah 43:19 (NRSV) ¹⁹*I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.*

Since I was a child I have watched and talked with people who retire. Retirement is welcomed as a blessing. It's often experienced as a crisis. I've known people who have lived their retirement days in boredom and depression. I've known others who have thrived in the freedom that they have been given.

How does a person plan for the unknown of retirement? As people retire they generally say they want to spend time with grandchildren and travel. Often they are mildly concerned about boredom and plan a hobby or two to carry them through grey days.

Retirement is a life-enriching gift that should not be taken for granted. Until the days of FDR and social security, retirement was far from a universal experience but was restricted to the wealthy. Retirement is a fruit that is the result of the greatness of America. This nation through social security and Medicare has made a commitment to the impaired and the elderly citizens of this nation.

Good work provides us with a sense of identity and an expression of purpose. Often retirees feel that they are no longer needed and even that they are a burden on others. I too have placed a lot of my sense of self-worth on my life as a pastor. It's sobering to think of leaving this satisfying life-style behind. It's also exciting to look forward to something new.

When I was in my twenties I read my first book on retirement. It was written by President Jimmy Carter, *Everything to Gain*. I've been impressed with this president because of the way he was able to reinvent his life after leaving the presidency, when he lost the election to Ronald Reagan. He might of simply played golf. But instead he dedicated himself to peace building and service projects to organizations like Habitat for Humanity. He continued to teach his adult Bible Study Class in Plains, Georgia. What an inspiration for all of us! In retirement I want to continue to be involved in love of God and people in this world through active, loving faith. I plan to keep working, just not as a pastor.

What I'm excited for is the freedom from time constraints. When I want to be with my family in Colorado or Minnesota, I'll be free to pick up and make the trip. I've arrived at the age where I need to exercise every day for self-care. At this time I have my streaks of doing well and then life at the church speeds up.

I'm also excited for Good Shepherd. Changes in pastoral leadership often result in anxiety. But this is a time starting now to explore new directions in serving God and community. The world is changing. Culture is changing. Aberdeen is changing. Every change frames an opportunity to love.

I thought that I would continue to work until the day Nancy retired. She has a couple of years left to go. But in the end three things motivated me to make this decision. The first was that I want a closer, physical relationship with my family, especially my parents as they enter into their later years. Second was the need for me to work on my physical fitness and reverse a recent trend of a rising A1C blood sugar score. The third is that I believe Good Shepherd has come to a place of many new opportunities and it will be energizing to bring in people who can explore new paths.

Church Council Highlights

The church council addressed staff affairs issues this month. They looked at Synod guidelines for pastoral vacations and increased the vacation time to five weeks a year. Pastors have very few weekends to spend with their families or to get away. The council authorized one weekend off a quarter, providing that all responsibilities are covered for that weekend. The council also resolved to make a market analysis of salary and benefit levels in Aberdeen to determine if we are paying a fair wage to our support staff.

The Life and Growth Board has redrawn Family Serving Groups to encourage our members involvement and volunteerism in the church. This new organizational plan will take effect in June.

Nominations Board is enthusiastic about the response that they received from their Time and Talent Survey. They also have definite plans to follow up with groups and people to make sure that people really get the opportunities where they have offered to serve.

The Properties Board shared an ambitious list of plans for the improvement of the property. They are planning to replace the boiler for the heating season. The current boiler is more than 40 years old. They are planning LED lighting to make the sanctuary brighter and lower electric costs at the same time. They talked about replacing the brush system for snow clearing on the 2005 lawn tractor. All of these things can be paid for out of the Dedicated Fund, Property Enhancement.

Mark Mehlhoff also said they would like to find a Bobcat, to help with snow removal. This is a *wish list* item. So, let us know, just in case, you might know of one that is available.

Financial Challenge

The financial report presented to church council in April was sobering. We're roughly \$20,000 short for the year, and it isn't even summer yet. If you're behind on your giving or haven't thought much about your giving, this would be a good time for a boost. Thank you for what you have already given so generously.

We have paid salaries and taken care of our building. We have been a blessing to others. We have encouraged the poor. We have supported our youth as they get ready to travel to Houston this summer. We have given funds to help people leaving prison to find a new life outside of prison walls. We have provided Christian education to children and adults. We have fed the hungry. We have paid benevolence offerings to the E.L.C.A. through our South Dakota Synod. We have supported and celebrated with Lutheran Social Services of South Dakota. We haven't given into the temptation to simply take care of ourselves, but have actively sought out ways to spread love and healing throughout the community and world. We share generously. It's who we are!

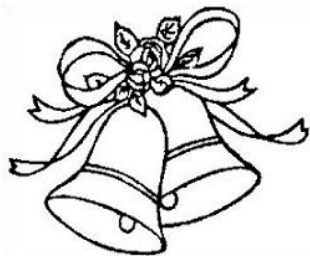
