# Resurrection Road



I took a little vacation time after Easter to help my mother drive back from Mesa, Arizona. She and my dad had spent their winter months out there for the past fifteen years or so and they always drove out, sharing the time behind the wheel. Mom wasn't sure if she wanted to keep going to Arizona after dad passed away in October but eventually did after spending Christmas and New Year's with my brothers and their families in Oregon. She flew out this time so she hired someone to drive her van there in order to have a vehicle to get around with. Since she wanted to make the drive home, perhaps one last time, and this is a long journey for her to take by herself, I made myself available and she found a cheap plane ticket to fly me out.

Before hitting the road I got to spend some time in the pool, hot tub and the warm Arizona sun, destressing and thawing-out, as well as visiting family and friends I hadn't seen in awhile; besides helping mom clean, fix things, and sort through dad's stuff that needed to be either given away, sold, or dividedup between my brothers and me. As I came to his golf clubs to pack them in the van to bring home for my son Jake to use, I paused for a moment and thought, "I need to take these out for one last go around here!" So, I put them in dad's golf cart and headed for the nine hole course in their park that he often golfed at. This was an emotional and difficult experience for me at times but also a good healing time as well. I felt that I was golfing with dad again! I could almost hear his voice of encouragement, as well as his critique of my golf skills—or lack of them! I was also very conscious of keeping his bag in order and his clubs clean. Dad was a very organized person and treated his stuff very well. After this little hiatus I got back to packing the van and suggested to mom that we should leave dad's golf clubs in Arizona so that my brothers or myself could make use of them when we come out for a visit. She was perfectly fine with that, especially after I told her about my golf outing with dad.

We were three hours behind our planned travel schedule when we finally hit the road for home the first day. This was the first time that mom was closing up the place for the summer without dad so there were many things to do that she had never taken care of before. I got a bit frustrated with her and anxious because she wouldn't let me help her with some things and she was becoming overwhelmed by it all. But I calmed down and finally understood when she explained to me that she really felt the need to know how to take care of things by herself. She did the same kind of thing with the operations of her new van and all of its electronic gadgets and buzzers. She took out the users' manual and researched anything she was uncertain about and then calmly addressed each problem. I could not have been more proud of her and I told her that dad would have been as well. Sure, she has had and will continue to have her sad, lonely, frustrating, and even resentful moments in adjusting to this life transition, but overall she has done admiringly well and has a strong determination to keep on keeping on. This road trip was a real test for her, and I think she passed with flying colors!! Dad liked to have things done a certain way, so usually just did them himself, but he still taught/prepared us all well.

We spent three long days on the road together. We made a point of acknowledging, but not necessarily stopping at all of the Dairy Queen's along the way; which dad always made sure were strategically located along any route he traveled. Sure, we hit a few rough spots; which is normal when any parent and their adult child travel together, but overall it was a great experience! Going into it I had some concern about the vast differences in the music selections we use to help spend the time to keep us alert when driving. This actually did not pose a major problem. Mom listened to her books on tape with her headphones while I drove and listened to the music that I enjoy, and while she drove she (continued on next page)

listened to music that helped me get some much needed rest! I listened too, however, and even though that particular style of music did not appeal to me, many of the songs were rich with healing messages and evoked some fond memories for mom; which made me much more appreciative of them. Some of you will most certainly be familiar with the following:

We listened to songs by Jim Reeves, one of my dad's favorite singers; which caused mom to recall times that she and dad had danced to some of those songs, as a smile came to her face and twinkle to her eye. Dancing was something they really enjoyed doing together at one time. We listened to songs by Anne Murray. Many of them were old standard love or folk songs or hymns. One song in particular caught my attention, and it was one I had never heard before. It really made me think of the journey of life; especially the personal/spiritual journey we experience when we face difficult challenges and the death of a loved one. Mom and I were on this journey together, but also by ourselves in some ways. The song is called, *"The Other Side"*, and the words are the following:

Through each life time, run rivers to cross, but what if there's no lifeline and you're sinking or lost? Just believe in your direction, and let your heart explore, 'cause you can't reach new horizons standing on the shore.

And there are mountains we need to climb but the mountains standing in our way are only in our minds, and the risk of going nowhere is the greatest risk of all. So just listen to the voice that says, "I'll catch you if you fall".

On the other side of doubt is faith. On the other side of pain lies strength. The journey may seem endless when you know the road is rough, but on the other side of fear is love.

For such a long time, I put my dreams aside. The tides of change felt dangerous, the mountains seemed too high. But my dreams were slowly fading as time went quickly by, so I took a breath with every step never knowing I would find...

On the other side of doubt is faith. On the other side of pain lies strength. The journey may seem endless when you know the road is rough, but on the other side of fear is love.

This whole experience with mom caused me to think of the experience that a couple of Jesus' disciples had on the road to Emmaus. Jesus had been crucified and now they were all alone to fend for themselves in a hostile world. Then, suddenly, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them, but they did not recognize him until he broke bread with them; recalling in their minds the last supper they shared with Jesus and the promises of God he enlightened and strengthened them with.

My mother once painted a picture of these three men walking and talking together on the road to Emmaus and it still hangs over the fireplace in the home that she and dad shared for the majority of their fifty year marriage and that I was raised in. I always experienced a great sense of peace and strength when I looked at this scene. The fact that the resurrected Christ shares our journey, no matter where it leads, makes it all possible and worth it! Though at times our strength and faith will be severely tested, we never travel alone. God provides exactly what we need to not only survive but also to thrive. Mom and I reached our destination not only in tact and still speaking to each other, but also a little improved and refreshed as far as our outlook on things and our relationship with God and each other. I hope this recounting of our journey helps you continue your journey down "Resurrection Road" with a renewed sense of confidence, peace, and faith!


## Celebration Sunday, May 16, 2010


## **MISSION OF THE MONTH**

But I do need your help. I do need your support.


Without <u>you</u>, to undergird me, I am helpless. <u>You</u> are my foundation, my supporting walls.


